For this assignment, you will find (or take) three photos of people modeling clothes (no lingerie or swimwear).

- A. Copy and paste each photo into this document.
- B. Describe each type of garment the person is wearing.
- C. Describe the design details for each garment
- D. Submit your assignment.

Part A. Add photos to this document

1. Download this document to your computer or device.
2. Locate three suitable photos.
 - Download a photo, scan from a magazine, or photograph your model.
3. **Save** your images to the device where you downloaded this document.
4. **Insert** your images into the designated spaces below. To do this:
 - Click on the picture icon found in the center of the blue box. This will bring up the option to browse your device and insert the desired image.
 - Adjust the size of each image so you are able to fit your photograph on the page. You may adjust the size by clicking on the image then dragging any corner.

Description

B. Describe each type of garment the model is wearing.

This model is wearing Stacey Sansom originals.

A fitted short sleeve dusty-rose cotton sateen blouse paired with a fully lined fitted navy-blue crepe flared skirt that falls just below the knee and finished off with a pair of brown leather gladiator-style wedge sandals.

C. Describe each design detail for each garment.

The fitted short sleeve dusty-rose cotton sateen blouse is an adjusted bodice with double open-darts combined with breast dart shaping. It has paired button grouping on a top-stitched placket and scoop neckline finished with a traditional Peter Pan collar. The narrowed bell-shaped short sleeves and the curved high-low hemline are finished with pressed knife pleats and top stitching. The fully lined below the knee navy-blue crepe skirt features 10 gores (panels) with godet-effect flouncing that starts at the knee and is finished with an inside yoke facing and back zipper. This is paired with a pair of brown leather gladiator sandals.

Describe each type of garment the model is wearing.</p> <p>This model is wearing a Ralph Lauren dress.</p> <p>Ivory sheath dress with halter neck and white sandals.</p>
	<p>C. Describe each design detail for each garment.</p> <p>This elegant sheath dress is constructed with an ivory sequined fabric and features a cross-over halter neck creating an exaggerated plunged keyhole. The back of the dress (see second picture) features a plunged back with a back closure strap below the shoulder blades. The floor length slightly flared high low hemline introduces a small train on the back of the skirt. The dress is paired with a pair of white sandals.</p>

Describe each type of garment the model is wearing.</p> <p>Model is wearing Versace suit (tuxedo) and bowtie.</p> <p>Black tuxedo jacket and slacks with a white long-sleeve tuxedo styled shirt finished with a black bowtie and paired with black men's dress shoes.</p>
	<p>C. Describe each design detail for each garment. <i>Include a description of the collar, neckline, sleeves, etc.</i></p> <p>This black single-breasted tuxedo features a silk shawl collar and satin trimmed welt waist pockets combined with a slash pocket on the left breast. The jacket closure features silk covered buttons. The jacket covers a white long-sleeved tuxedo shirt with a spread collar and covered fly-front placket. The pants are a traditional black tuxedo pants finished with a no-break hem (just above the shoe). The look is finished with a traditional black silk butterfly bowtie and paired with black close-laced men's leather derby shoes.</p>

Part D. Submit the Assignment

After you added all the images and written your descriptions, submit your work. Before submitting, save this assignment as a PDF.

The steps below describe how to do this.

1. With your Microsoft Word document open, click the **File** tab (top left of the screen).
2. **Save** your Word document.
3. Click the **File** tab again.
4. If you have the option to choose **Save as PDF**, select that option and continue to follow the instructions (you will skip step 7 below). If you don't have that option, choose **Save As**.
5. Select the location where you want the file saved.
6. Enter your desired file name. Recommended: Use the actual assignment name so you can readily find the file in the future. Include your name. Use hyphens or underscores to separate words. Example: If your name is Mary Smith, you might use the following to name the file: **W02-DesignDetails-Smith**
7. Change the file type by clicking the dropdown menu in the **Save as type** dropdown. Select **PDF** from the menu.
8. Select **Save**.

Return to I-Learn and submit the PDF to your instructor.
