I also updated the location on my current place of employment (my business), thus making my profile more searchable via location. I also listed the employment type as being self-employed. I did initially add media for my current employment, but I was not happy with the way that it cropped the images, so I removed them. I will have to resize accordingly, but the help page was not all that useful initially.

I then added a section for organizations to highlight the Honor Society I was a member of because many alumni members network regularly on LinkedIn and other platforms.
